

## TIMING FAQ

- 1. It was noted that the project had to be completed by July of 2026. Projects this extensive where plans are still unsettled tend to take longer than anticipated. Given this, as with any project, finishing on time is a major risk. Does the need to finish entail only the King Street project or all projects?**
  - a. Funds for all projects funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) are required to be expended by December 31, 2026. The project timeline currently includes a state agency (administering the ARPA funds) induced completion date of June 2026. Construction of storm sewer upgrades, the pump station and the controls building are planned to occur concurrently. The City works directly with our engineers, contractors, and subcontractors in managing projects, and is confident these projects will be completed within the proposed timeframe.
  
- 2. If just the King Street project: What if the King Street project isn't completed by that time?**
  - a. As described above, the December 31, 2026, completion date applies to all ARPA-funded projects.
  
- 3. If not completed on time what are the plans to fund the completion? Given the risk of finishing on time, shouldn't the first course of action be increasing the pipes to see how that works? Perhaps the rest would not be required.**
  - a. All proposed components are required to reduce the flood risk within the subject watershed to the desired level of service. The City has secured appropriate funding opportunities and works closely with our engineers, contractors, and subcontractors on managing projects through completion, and is confident that these projects will be completed within the proposed timeframe.
